Zeanah, H. Egger, A. Lieberman, A. Carter, MM Gleanson). She is supervisor of the national project of preschool mental health units implementation, under joint sponsorship of the Ministry of Health and Sacta-Rashi Foundation (1999- now). She is visiting Professor at Valencia (Spain) University, International early childhood psychology program, sponsored by AEPEA. She is President of the World Association of Infant Mental Health (WAIMH), (2012-2016).
